

# Resources to Create 3 Minute Video



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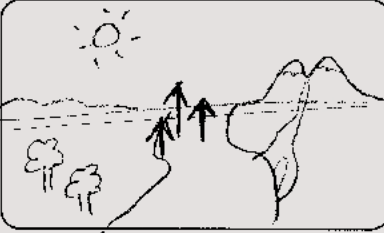
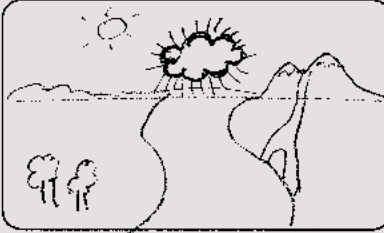

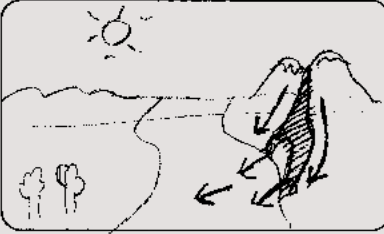
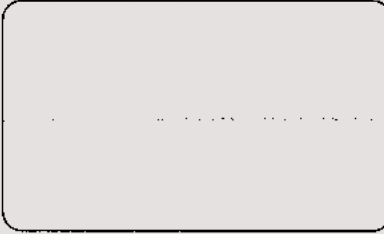
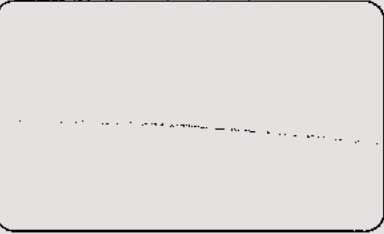
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# Preparation

1. First create either a storyboard or script to organize the information and timing of your video. Below is a storyboard and a script for an animation of the water cycle.

<p>1.</p>  <p>Show arrows for evaporation</p>	<p>2.</p>  <p>show cloud forming for condensation</p>	<p>3.</p>  <p>show rain, cloud rain for precipitation</p>
<p>4.</p>  <p>Show streams empty back into river for "collection"</p>		

1. Show water evaporate from river. -5 seconds
2. Show water condense to form cloud. -5 seconds
3. Show storm cloud move over mountain and rain -7.5 seconds
4. Show water empty back into river from streams -7.5 seconds.

# Creating a Video in Powerpoint

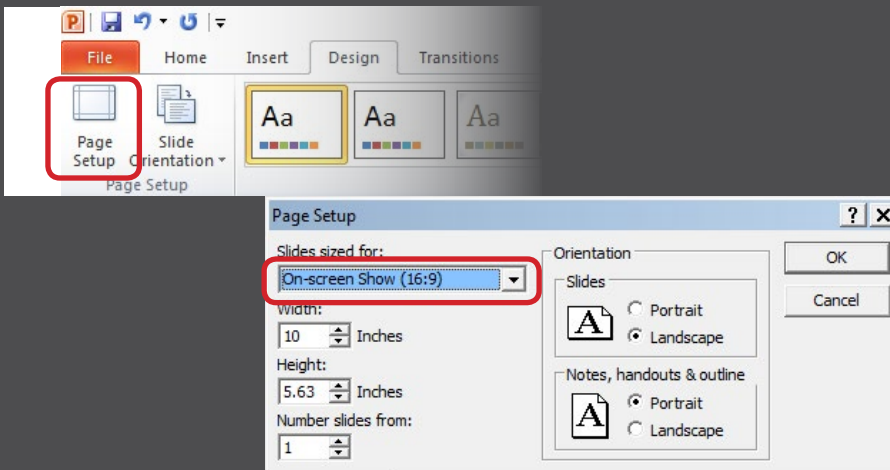

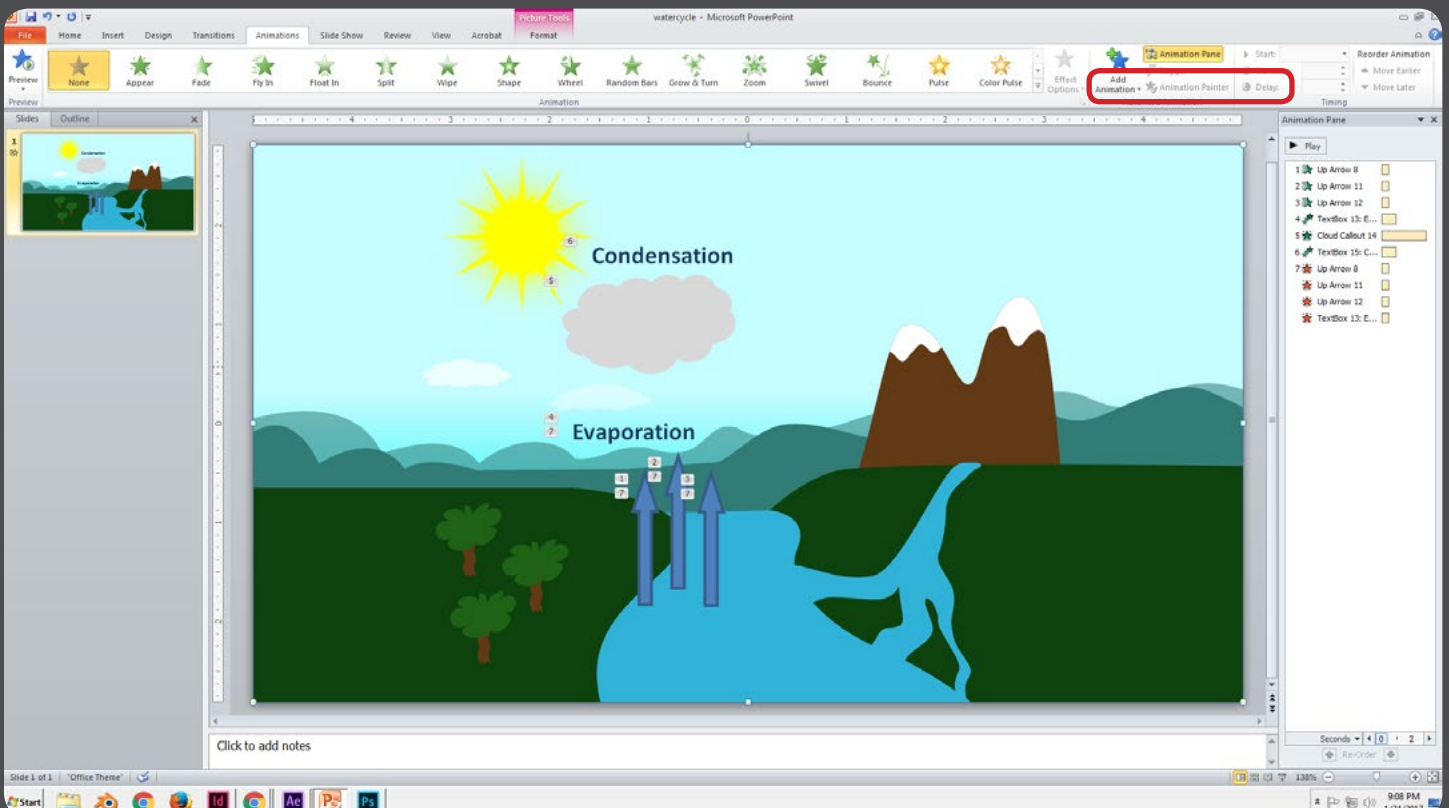

1. Click Design tab then select "Page Setup", select 16:9 aspect ratio for a widescreen.

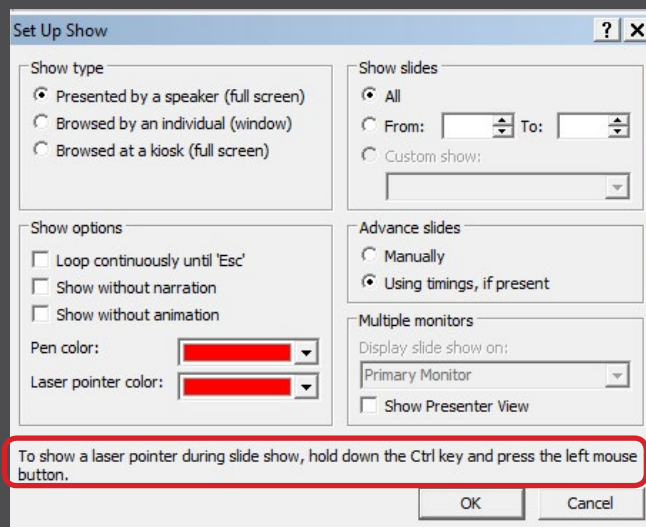
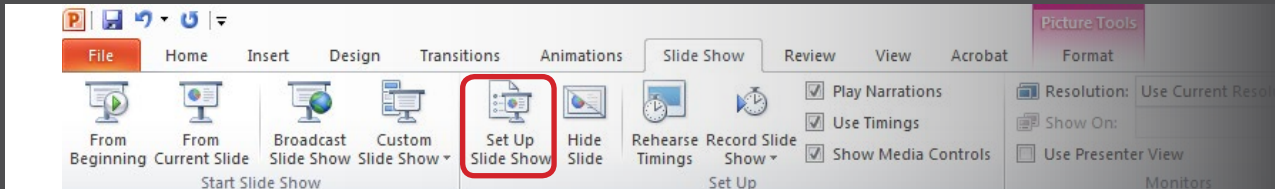


2. Create your animations. The animation pane will make organization easier.

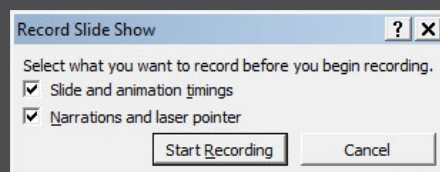
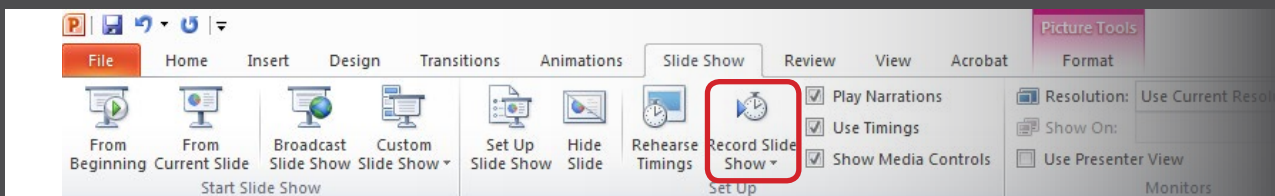


# Creating a Video in Powerpoint

3. Select the Slide Show tab then select "Set Up Show". Note the options.



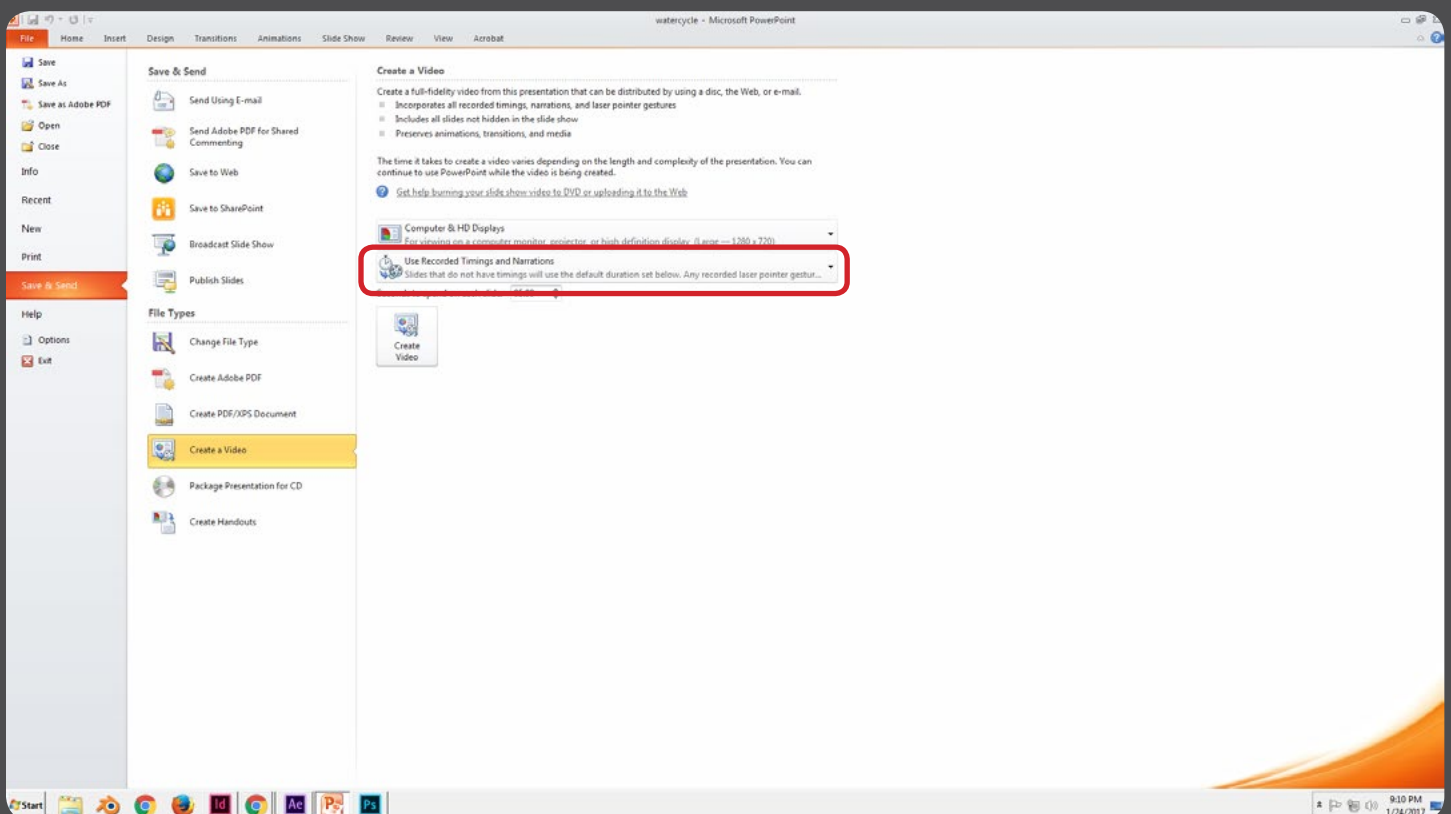
4. Select "Record Slide Show". The "Narrations and laser points" checkbox may only be selected if there is an available microphone. The DMC has a [podcast mic](#) and an [audio recorder](#) which can be plugged into a computer.



# Creating a Video in Powerpoint

5. Once the slide/animation timings and laser pointer gestures have been recorded, powerpoint will remember the timings for the video creation step.

Click File>Save & Send>Create a Video. You will have the option to either use the recorded timings or use the typical powerpoint timings.



# Recording a Live Action Lecture Video

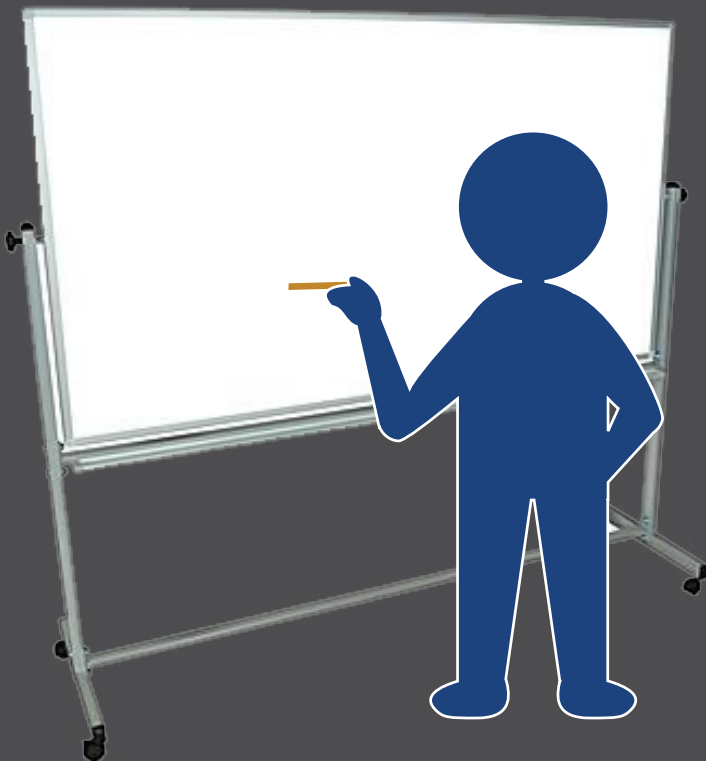

1. Setup a camera and tripod in a well lit room and record your presentation. Cameras, video cameras and tripods can be checked out from the DMC. Select the links below to view DMC equipment.

1. Mount the camera on the tripod, make the camera facing down. Make the panel lights facing downward. Try to make the light even on the white piece of paper to avoid shadows when you are drawing.
